Pastor Mike shared some tremendous words that encouraged the entire congregation. This retreat is held every year on the Virginia District. I also attended the M-19 Conference in Kansas City, Missouri. There were plenary sessions as well as individual workshops we could attend. Sonya Billings transferred her membership from another Nazarene Church. We also officially brought into membership Jordon Hilliard, Jacob Hilliard. We look forward to seeing how God is going to continue to use them here at Varina.

We experienced baptisms in a unique way this year. Through a powerful message and a moving of the Holy Spirit, we had over fifteen people come to be baptized by the pouring or sprinkling of water. Each one of these individuals shared an outward expression of an inner change because of the change Christ made in each of their lives.

### Engaging the Culture

We are striving to find more ways to get involved in our community. This year was no exception! Here are some of the ways we were able to connect with Ward Elementary. Cheri Sheridan and I volunteered twice a week to do Drop Off in the morning, which is from 7:20-7:40. We have been able to build a connection with parents/students, administration, and teachers. Our church also provided goodies for the teachers once a month and provided a healthy snack once a month for their afterschool clubs. Several of us participate in the Trunk or Treat that was held at the local school. Our Men's Ministry is working with the STEAM teacher to stain the gazebo, fix picnic tables, and beautify the courtyard that they use for outside instruction time. We offered a free Community Back to School Party in hopes of engaging those around us.

This coming year, we plan to have Sundays dedicated to recognizing teachers, medical personnel, first responders, among others. We will continue to help those in need, provide food for the veterans at Liberation House, and find ways to help the homeless. Our plan is to offer classes that would attract the community, as well as educate those in our church. We intend to offer such things as a finance class, Sexual Awareness Training, and a CPR class just to name a few.

What an exciting year this has been as our church continues to embrace and fulfill God's mission for Varina Church of the Nazarene! It has been my pleasure and honor to serve as Church Board Secretary this past year.

### Below are a few highlights from the Church Board meetings:

- As a Church Board we began going through the book, *Organic Outreach for Ordinary People*, by Kevin G. Harney. The book has challenged each of us to think about evangelism in terms of everyday living instead of as something that only a few are gifted to do. We have held each other accountable as to how we are investing in the lives of others.
- We continue to work on our church expansion project. As part of our vision of *Equipping the Church, Engaging the Culture,* God has also called us to *Expand His Kingdom*.
- With the approval of the Church Board, we have increased church membership by nine.
- The Church Board elected Robbie Wheat as Secretary and Norma Jean Schleck as Treasurer.
- We held our annual church meeting and celebrated Varina's 30<sup>th</sup> birthday. During the service, a Distinguished Service Award was presented to Allen Roberson, and a Memorial Roll Certificate in memory of Betty Helmick was given to her family. Pastor Mike Brown delivered the message, and we ended the day with a luncheon and games outside.
- In November, enough money was pledged to pay off our existing mortgage. We celebrated by having a mortgage burning the last Sunday of December.
- Joe Greene felt called to Connecting Pointe Church of the Nazarene to become their Family Ministries Pastor. We continue to pray for God's call on Joe's life. Joe was a Board member, and upon his resignation, Norma Jean Schleck filled his term through the 2019-2020 church year. Norma Jean was next in line based on our church election.
- The Church Board approved to send Pastor Joyce and Cheri Sheridan to the M-19 Conference in Kansas City, Missouri. This conference takes place every two years and provides valuable ministry insights.
- Per the Church of the Nazarene manual, Pastor Joyce is entitled to a Sabbatical and has been in discussion with the Church Board as to when this will occur.
- The Church Board approved a salary increase for Pastor Joyce.
- The Church Board approved the Finance Team's proposed 2019-2020 budget.

### Finance Team Annual Report 2018-2019

The Finance Team of the Varina Church of the Nazarene Pastor Joyce – Ex-officio, Glenn Grambo, Chairman, Norma Jean Schleck - Treasurer, Bob Walker, Donnie Adkins, Jim Schimpf, and Robert Haden. We would like to say Thank You for allowing us to serve you and the Lord this year. We have finished this year ahead of our expenses and the state of the Church's finances is solid! Some of the highlights of our year will be talked about below, but without your efforts in tithing and offerings, our church would not have been able to accomplish the highlights.

Our church received \$176,849.69 in Tithes and Offerings and had expenses of \$190,196.54. The income represents about a 6.7% drop from last year while our expenses were up 5%.

Our average Tithe and Offering per individual adult was \$45.28 weekly this year or a reduction of 3.5% from last year. This roughly translates to an annual salary of \$23,546 per adult. We continue to work towards God's desire of the 10% Tithe.

This keeps us fiscally sound and as God blesses our efforts with His money, we can respond to where He is working in our church! ### **MINISTRY HAPPENINGS:**

- Henry Ragland continues to hold the position of Men's Prayer Group leader this year. He has been leading the monthly Men's Breakfast this past year. It continues to average about 10-15 attendees per month. The time change from the first Sunday morning to the first Saturday morning of the month continues to allow for more devotional, fellowship, and prayer time for the attendees.
- The Men's Small group completed an in-depth study of the Purpose Driven Life (PDL) during 2018. It has prepared the men of the group to begin mentoring and partnering with other men of the church using PDL, other proven mentoring methods, and the Bible. The church sponsored a holiday dinner for the small group to celebrate completion of the study and the Christmas season. We began a study of the book "Organic Outreach" January 2019.
- The "Helping Hands" service and maintenance ministry was again able to assist a few church members/families with special projects and regular home maintenance this past year.

### PLANS FOR THE COMING YEAR:

- While the events committee formation continues to completion, we will be pressing on to try and bring some successful events to the men such as "Fishing with Dad" and "The Spud Games."
- We will continue to work to strengthen the connections among the Varina men via a one-on-one men's discipleship/mentoring ministry program. With the completion of "The Purpose Driven life" study by the men's small group we have made one small step in a positive direction toward that end.
- With Bill Good stepping down as leader of the "Helping Hands" ministry, I have once again begun to pray for God to help me fill that position.

### **MINISTRY BUDGET:**

Most expenses associated with the Men's Ministry activities were handled either via donations by volunteers or funded by the men themselves. This basically included food for the breakfasts, refreshments for the weekly small group and the book/bible study materials for the studies. We held a holiday dinner for the men's small group that used approximately 45 % of the church budget allocated for Men's Ministry.

Events in the coming year, may make use of larger percentage funding budgeted for this next fiscal year.

### **GOD'S WORKING:**

I thank God for answered prayers and continued blessings for the men and families of the church. However, I believe there is still a huge need for us as men and a church to continue with even more intensive prayers for what is needed for us to equip ourselves, engage the culture, and carry out God's will for our church and community.

The activities and events of missions through Nazarene Missions International this year were meant to compliment an already active congregation who want to serve the community and impact the lives of many people. Reaching others with the message of the The Gospel was accomplished through giving on \$5 Sunday for World Mission Broadcast. Varina CON will always step up to needs that can have a big impact. The impact of WMBC was presented through a video showing the impact a message can have via transitor radio to a group of students meeting under a tree.

We embraced our LINKS missionaries, Rev. Ron and Shelva Calhoun, now retired from service at Africa Nazarene University. Gifts, cards and e-mails were sent to celebrate their birthdays and Holidays.

Bike A Thon is a big deal at Varina CON. The children rode laps in the church parking lot, were cheered on by family and friends and their sponsors contributed \$858.00 to Compassion 575. The gift provides education, meals, health care and Christian interaction to children in a Child Development Center; mostly likely in Sri Lanka or Bangladesh.

Kari Badgerow, volunteer missionary with a passion for medical missions, shared her story and blessed our hearts. Her stories enlarged our understanding of what a person on a team can accomplish going from village to village by providing medication and treatment to people without access to medical care. A generous love offering of \$384 was provided to Kari to be used for her daughter to serve over several months in 3 locations; including a time with Rolf and Debbie Kleinfeld in Cambodia.

The children participated in the Faith Promise event with Kari Badgerow by making posters; displayed by a parade, of their understanding of Faith Promise. The teaching and work on the posters took place over 4 weeks and provided an opportunity to talk about all of the ways the CON is able to share The Gospel.

The annual yard sale for missions was well stocked with generous "stuff" from many, many people. The funds, \$1162.85, will be used towards a mission trip in the future. Plans are in the thought stage for the sale this year and how to maximize the sale of more "stuff". Loose change and gifts were given to the Alabaster Offering in September and February for a total of \$581.58. These funds combined with giving from churches around the world will supply need funds for missionary housing, hospitals, schools, churches and other permanent structures to support Nazarenes missions.

Rolf and Debbie Kleinfeld, Director and missionaries to the field of Cambodia shared a great update on how the CON is developing in this country in an informal meal time. Shannon Smith, a volunteer missionary, visited on the same evening and shared how the Lord was directing her to spend two years serving with Rolf and Debbie. A generous offering, \$1001.38, was given to Rolf and Debbie and a gift was sent to Shannon's support account. Following the Kleinfeld's

story of ministry has been amazing as God has allowed tentative relationships to become friendships that opened opportunities to share the Gospel in a Buddhist country. Pastor preached a message on the evil of Human Trafficking. It is a terrible scourge on society and I commend people who are deep into the rescue of individuals caught in such a life. I commend Pastor for preaching and teaching about such a tough topic.

The whole congregation rallied around the Crisis Care Kit Tree and provided supplies to fill 73 kits. A great group of youth and adults put the kits together and ensured each kit met the content requirements. The kits have been delivered to Fawn Grove in Pylesville, MD. Youth and adults from Varina CON and Highland Springs CON will participate in a mission trip, April 1 – 3, to the Compassionate Ministries Center at Fawn Grove. The assignment will be to support the staff at the center with packing kits in banana boxes to be shipped in semi containers and sorting clothes into boxes.

Faith Promise 2.0 is set for May 2<sup>nd</sup> with Rev. Rigoberto and Martha Acosta; retired Hispanic Coordinator for the Virginia District. Rev. Acosta's story will share first hand how monies given to the World Evangelism Fund, a missionary being sent to Nicaragua and his father hearing The Gospel changed the entire course of a family's future. Varina CON is faithful to support the World Evangelism Fund; we are fully engaged in the mission to Make Christlike Disciples in the Nations.

It has been a great year of service together in the church. Thank you to each person who gave time, encouraged a child to participate, brought food, worked hard, gave from their resources and loved on others.
